## REFLECTIONS ON THE IMAC EVENT

The weekend of July 8 & 9, 2006, the Salinas Area Modelers hosted an IMAC (International Miniature Aerobatic Club) contest. For those of you that might not know, this is an aerobatic competition that involving five levels or expertise — Basic, Sportsman, Intermediate, Advanced and Unlimited. Each class flies a sequence of maneuvers that is changed every year. The maneuvers are flown within a space box 1,800 feet wide, 400 feet high and 400 feet deep.

There are two judges for each flight and they award the pilot a score from 0 to 10 on each maneuver. However, each maneuver is also given a difficulty factor (called a K factor) which is multiplied by the judges 0-10 score. The judge's scores are entered into a computer program where the mathematics is automatically done to give a total point score for each flight. Pilots normally fly their given sequence twice during each flight. At the end of the contest the lowest score is thrown out and the winners in each class are determined by the total score of all flights.

All planes (with a couple of exceptions) were at least ¼ scale or larger of a full scale aerobatic aircraft. Since IMAC is the model counter part to IAC (International Aerobatic Club) models must be replicas of full scale airplanes that have competed in IAC contests. The only exception is in the BASIC beginner class where any model can be flown.

There were 31 pilots involved in the competition, two of them being our own Steve Saulovich (Intermediate) and Dave Stoik (Advanced). It was nice to see a couple of young competitors taking part. When I say young I mean somewhere around twelve years old—give or take a year. These kids were really enthusiastic. One of them put on an astounding demonstration with a foamy Sunday morning before the competition began. It was a very nice weekend getting a little windy mid afternoon, but that didn't seem to bother the competitors. They still flew with great precision and accuracy.

Hosting such an event exposes SAM members to another aspect of the hobby/sport. Besides that it gives us an opportunity to put a little money in our treasury. We did quite well in that respect putting an excess of \$1,000 in our bank account. It was well

worth the inconvenience imposed on all of us for not being able to fly during the weekend. Just keep in mind that if we did not host events like this our dues would be higher. Thanks to all the people that did come out to help. Dave Stoik said many of the contestants commented on how well our club supported him in this event. Apparently most clubs that host the IMAC competition don't support the event well at all. We sold coffee, donuts and lunches both days. We also worked as scribes for the judges or did anything else that needed to be done. Thanks to all that worked. It would be nice to get more people out to help with these events. It is a very effortless way to raise money for the club. We received many positive comments from the visiting contestants. We will be hosting the event again next year so plan to come out and help.

Thanks to Dave Stoik for being the contest director bringing this event to our field. **How it Works by Alan Brown**

**Q:** I have a sailplane which gives me a lot of nose-down pitching when I put the top surface air brakes out. Hasn't happened on previous airplanes.

**A:** The majority of the lift on an airfoil is generated by the front 20% of the top surface. That will be particularly true for a well-designed airfoil. Depending on the position of the airbrakes on the top surface, the effect of deploying will both add drag and reduce lift. With a good airfoil, we'll lose a lot of the forward lift, which can result in a nosedown pitching moment, as the center of lift moves back. There can also be the complication of a change of flow pattern over the horizontal tail, depending on whether it's high or low.

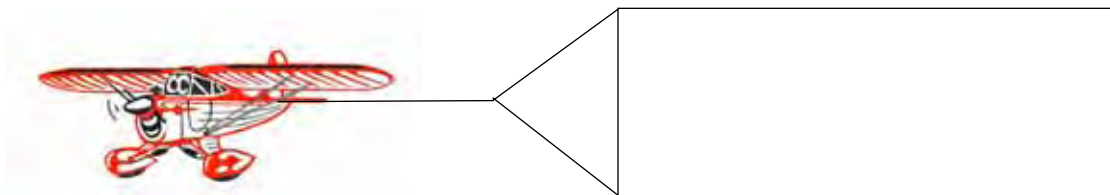
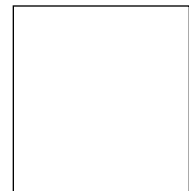
